EPHESIANS 2:14-16





The Church suffers today because of the antagonism of the groups and opinions that are warring within her; as a result, it becomes ever harder for the Christian to know where right lies and to distinguish true prophets from false ones. Our topic has much to do with the discernment of spirits, about which we might formulate this basic rule: where joylessness reigns, where humor dies, the spirit of Jesus Christ is assuredly absent. But the reverse is also true: joy is a sign of grace. One who is cheerful from the bottom of his heart, one who has suffered but not lost joy, cannot be far from the God of the evangelium, whose first word on the threshold of the New Testament is "Rejoice!"¹⁰²
